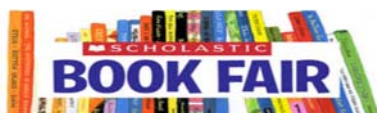


## Message from Ms Edge

### **Cultural Week**

Monday 3rd July to Friday 7th July is Cultural Week. During the week children will have the opportunity to develop their understanding of the British Values we share and how they relate to our school values as well as celebrating differences and the many different cultures of the Scott Wilkie community. School lunches will also be themed for the week starting of with Pie & Mash day and then foods from different continents. Children, staff (and parents) can dress up in Red, White and Blue on Monday and then clothes that represent their culture on Friday.

### **KEEPING SAFE IN THE SUN**

The sunny weather is predicted to return, so can we please ask that you ensure that you apply sunscreen to your children before they come in to school and if you would like them to



reapply it during the day that you provide a bottle clearly marked with their name. Please can you also ensure that you provide your child with a sun hat to wear when outside at playtimes and that they are wearing suitable clothing for the weather. A reminder—sandals should have straps/buckles and not be high heels, mules or flip flops to ensure your child is safe.

### **NURSERY DOUGH DISCO**

Nursery hosted a Play Dough Disco. Playing with play dough helps to develop finger strength and muscles in the hands. This is so important, because it means that the children will be able to write and draw much more easily. Parents and carers made play dough from scratch with the children, with lots of mixing, pouring and measuring. After they had made the play dough, the next step was to turn the music up! They patted, rolled, poked and squeezed their play dough to the beat of the music and had time for some freestyle moves too. All the children loved making their own play dough and getting messy! Parents and carers called the event 'fun', 'engaging' and 'insightful' alongside many other lovely comments.
